Winning money during the Breeders' Cup is every handicapper and bettor's goal. Picking a winner is fun and having the right horse is great, but there's nothing like coming out of the two big championship days with a hefty chunk of profit.

Handicapping the 191 entries over 14 races is an absolutely daunting task. Many players will take too much time studying all the horses and watching replays, while not spending enough time constructing their wagers. This is where a lot of players fall short when trying to make a profit betting the Breeders' Cup. A rule of thumb is that you should spend at least half of your time handicapping and half of your time constructing your tickets.

The key to sorting through the whole Breeders' Cup madness is formulating strong opinions and then leveraging them with smart wagers using the right options on the extensive wagering menu to maximize your return on investment.

With the mass amount of horses in the most competitive, large fields of the year, it's very difficult to focus, so I'll take you through my strongest opinions and show you how I'm planning to tackle Breeders' Cup 2018.

I'll start with the value horses I'm keying around in my wagers over the two days and then show you how I'll leverage these horses using different options on the wagering menu using a \$400 budget.

Let's start building a foundation towards a successful 2018 Breeders' Cup!

KEY VALUE PLAYS

The horses I have the strongest opinions will run well at good prices are as follows (shown with their morning line odds):

Friday, November 2

Race 7 - Juvenile Fillies - #4 Restless Rider (9/2) Race 8 - Juvenile Turf - #4 Forty Under (5/1)

Saturday, November 3

Race 4 - Turf Sprint - #11 World of Trouble (6/1) Race 6 - Filly & Mare Turf - #1 Fourstarcrook (5/1) Race 11 - Classic - #3 Catholic Boy (8/1)

None of these horses are the morning line favorites in their respective races. None of them are massive long-shots either, but with the large fields, large pools and the highest level of competition at the Breeders' Cup, you don't have to hit a 45/1 shot to make money.

A rule of wagering is to start with your win bet and then build from there, so each one of these horses will get at least a \$10 win bet from me before I dive into the exotic wagers below.

BETTING WITH LARGER BASE INCREMENTS

I will now leverage the horses above with logical winners (even with the favorites) in exactas, trifectas, and in adjoining races in doubles and Pick 3s. My goal is to cash those tickets for larger increments than the base wager by focusing my bets.

It is very easy to get caught up including 6 or 7 horses in each Breeders' Cup race because these are the best horses in the world and it's very easy to make cases for many horses to win.

If you include too many horses, though, your wagers will increase in size or you'll have to decrease the increment of your wager to a lower amount. For example, you can play a 2×3 double for a \$5 base bet for \$30. If you start including too many horses and play a 5×6 double, then you'll only be able to play it for a \$1 base increment for that same \$30. Having a double for only \$1 when it pays for example \$60 would net only a \$30 profit, in this scenario. That same double would return \$300 (i.e., $$5 \times $60 = 300) for your \$30 investment, if you're able to narrow your focus to only 2 or 3 horses in each race.

Therefore, you have to draw the line somewhere on Breeders' Cup day and using more than 2 or 3 horses in each race is beyond my small budget play. Even if you have a larger budget, the math above extrapolates and you start seeing thin profits in return.

You have to be willing to say to yourself, "I'm going to play the horses I feel strongest about. If some other horse comes in that I would've had if I went 5 deep in that leg, then I can live with it." There's a lot of mental exhaustion to betting the Breeders' Cup, so get your mind right, focused and let's dig into our exotics plays!

FUTURE STARS FRIDAY

On Friday, I'll dip my toe into the pools just a little bit. With the new format of only juvenile Breeders' Cup races on Friday, it smells like a recipe for chaos and will make it very difficult to string together three or four races in a row to cash in multi-race tickets playing with this small budget. I usually don't play heavy on Friday of Breeders' Cup day anyway and keep most of my budget for the Saturday action. With this new arrangement of only two-year old races on Friday, I have every reason to keep that approach, since it is expected the results will be unpredictable.

FRIDAY RACE #5 - JUVENILE TURF SPRINT:

The Breeders' Cup action starts with a new race in the Juvenile Turf Sprint and this is a race for me to only make a small "action" play (i.e., a bet to just have something on the race to make it fun and try to build bankroll if it hits). Playing with \$350 in my budget (after my \$50 in win wagers), I will invest only \$12 into a three-horse exacts box here.

#1 Strike Silver (4/1) is my top choice (and morning line favorite) in the race, as his last-to-first, late-charging win in the Indian Summer going this $5\frac{1}{2}$ furlong distance over the Keeneland grass in his turf debut was jaw dropping. Amazingly, the Mark Casse-trainee had shown early zip in his first two starts on dirt, so he has shown great versatility to move to the turf and then become a one-run closer in his only grass start.

Without any previous results for this new Juvenile Turf Sprint from past years, the Indian Summer would seem to be a key prep for this race, so the filly that Strike Silver necked out there, #9 Chelsea Cloisters (8/1), is one to include here. She has looked good working at Churchill in the mornings and cuts back to her preferred trip for turf sprint training specialist Wesley Ward.

The best of the Europeans may be #2 Soldier's Call (9/2), who showed speed in the Group 1 Prix de l'Abbaye at Longchamp in France to start October. He was chased down there and could only muster a close third-place finish going 5 furlongs, but was facing older horses, which is rarely seen in American racing.

The action play in Race #5 – Juvenile Turf Sprint:

FRIDAY RACE #6 - JUVENILE FILLIES TURF:

Now we get into a race in the Juvenile Fillies Turf, where we have a strong favorite and a filly I've been watching for months since I visited her stall at Saratoga, #6 Newspaperofrecord (2/1). Trained by Chad Brown, who has won this race 3 of the past 4 years, Newspaperofrecord is getting hyped up as the next champion Lady Eli after crushing her first two races both over yielding turf, including the Grade 2 Miss Grillo at Belmont, which has been a key prep in past years for the Breeders' Cup. She will be a well-bet favorite over possible similar soft turf conditions she's had in her first two starts, so I'll look for a longshot filly to play her heavy in an exacta to try to get value.

The top candidate to fill that role is British-bred #14 East (20/1), who has also only run twice in her career, but unleashed a nice turn-of-foot down the middle of the Saint Cloud grass in France taking the Group 3 Prix Thomas Bryon to start October getting a nice Timeform Rating of 95 for that effort. East has been getting a lot of hype from pundits and should be a square price, trained by Kevin Ryan, who isn't a big-name trainer, but is well-respected. Breaking from the far outside #14 post is a concern, but at the price is worth an action play.

FRIDAY RACE #7 – JUVENILE FILLIES:

My first value play of the day comes in the Juvenile Fil-

lies with #4 Restless Rider (9/2), who has two wins at Churchill, including a remarkable win in the Debutante Stakes in June, where she was stopped cold behind a filly that went wrong on the lead, but then re-rallied to draw off by 11½ lengths. She ran big in her runner-up finish in the Grade 1 Spinaway at Saratoga and then cruised in the Grade 1 Alcibiades for trainer Ken McPeek.

It will be tough for Restless Rider to beat favorite #10 Bellafina (2/1) coming in California with three straight graded stakes wins (including two straight Grade 1s), but these are two-year old fillies, so a jump up from Restless Rider from her 84 Beyer Speed Figure in the Alcibiades is possible to match Bellafina's 89 in her Grade 1 Chandelier win. Those are the two to play heavy in an exacta.

I'll may also play trifectas with these two and Spinaway winner #8 Sippican Harbor (12/1), as I discussed in my East vs. West article that you can check out on RacingDudes.com.

FRIDAY RACE #8 – JUVENILE TURF:

The Juvenile Turf is up next and has been dominated recently by the Europeans and trainer Aidan O'Brien, so his top charge #14 Anthony Van Dyck (4/1) has to be used here as the favorite.

I will try to buck that trend with #4 Forty Under (5/1), though, who recently beat a very good field in the Grade 3 Pilgrim at Belmont Park to end September. That race was over a yielding turf course and the Jeremiah Engelhart-trainee is likely to get similar conditions at Churchill. Forty Under's work over the Churchill turf on October 26 was slow on the clock over soft sod, but vi-

sually impressive, as he was stretching out late with a big gallop out. He is flourishing at a price I can buy into

FRIDAY RACE #9 - JUVENILE:

The crown jewel at the end of the Friday Breeders' Cup action is the Juvenile. Two-time Triple Crown winning trainer Bob Baffert has a strong prospect in #9 Game Winner (9/5), who has dominated two back-to-back Grade 1s in California.

Chad Brown, who won this race last year with Good Magic, brings front-running burner #6 Complexity (5/2) this year, who absolutely blitzed the field gate-to-wire in the Grade 1 Champagne, but now needs to stretch out to two-turns for the first time in the Juvenile.

The runner-up in the Champagne, #11 Code of Honor (5/1), will be the "wise guy" horse after stumbling at the start and charging home late. Code of Honor should get plenty of pace to close into here for trainer Shug McGaughey.

These three will be the top three betting choices likely, so it'll be tough to make money here. The one longshot to use in all exotics is #1 Dueling (20/1), who has been facing top competition out west and freaked when he broke his maiden in his last race stretching out to a mile.

I will look to hook this race up with my strong opinion in the Breeders' Cup Classic in the two-day double. I've looked to leverage some of the two-day doubles allowing me to play my strongest opinions with logical winners on each side of the double (as you might have seen in the bets above). It's always great to be alive in the two-day doubles and with three options, I'll play them all, since I have a strong opinion on at least one side of each double.

BREEDERS' CUP SATURDAY

By restricting myself to play only \$128 in wagers on Day 1, I've played less 32% of my budget, plus I may be alive in some of my two-day wagers, which I invested \$36 into. Now I can focus on attacking the Saturday-card with \$272 and make some strong wagers.

SATURDAY RACE #3 – FILLY & MARE SPRINT:

The Filly & Mare Sprint starts the day and Baffert brings in a strong favorite in #13 Marley's Freedom (8/5), who throttled the Grade 1 Ballerina field at Saratoga in her last race. She had to go wide there and will be wide here drawing the 13 post, but it didn't matter in Saratoga and might not matter here. She was much the best in that race and most likely much the best in this division. Kicking off the day with some Pick 3 action is a good way to leverage the favorite with my strong opinions in the next two legs.

There are three fillies in here that scare me that they can beat Marley's Freedom with their best effort and one of them did in her last race, #1 Selcourt (4/1). Off more than 7 months since she beat Marley's Freedom in the Grade 2 Santa Monica in March, Selcourt is one of the fastest horses in the race and should be a pace presence. One note, when Selcourt won that race in March,

Marley's Freedom was trained by Bob Hess, not Baffert, so that is important to consider along with the long lay-off.

The best three-year old filly in the field, #8 Mia Mischief (15/1), ran her top Beyer figure of 97 at Churchill when she ran away from the field in the Grade 2 Eight Belles. She ran well over the summer at Saratoga for Hall of Fame trainer Steve Asmussen.

The star of morning workouts at Churchill over the weekend was #5 Golden Mischief (10/1), who is coming off an impressive win at Keeneland in the Grade 2 TCA for trainer Brad Cox. She may be rounding into top form to run a big race at a nice price.

I'll back up in the Pick 3 with these two as follows:

SATURDAY RACE #4 - TURF SPRINT:

Hoping to be alive in the Pick 3, I won't do much in the Turf Sprint, since this race can go a lot of ways and will be a mad scramble. The three-year-old #11 World of Trouble (6/1) is the one that intrigues me, as he's the new face in this division trying his elders for the first time. He is one of the fastest colts in this sophomore crop, as was evident how he wore down top sprinter Promises Fulfilled in the Grade 2 Woody Stephens when he was still running on dirt. A move to the grass has boosted him into the winner's circle twice including stakes wins at Saratoga and Belmont in front-running fashion over yielding and good turf courses, which he may find at Churchill.

World of Trouble will be one of the main early speeds in the Turf Sprint, so I'll match him up with three horses that can come off the pace in #5 Disco Partner (7/2), #12 Will Call (20/1)and #2 Bucchero (10/1).

Disco Partner is one of my favorite horses in training and once he gets clear on a firm turf, he may be the fastest horse in the world over the grass. The problem here is that he may get softer footing than his preference with rain in the forecast this week in Louisville. The

Christophe Clement charge just won his last out over a good turf at Belmont, so maybe his preference has changed a bit, and he's one I can't let beat me.

Will Call and Bucchero are the local Kentucky horses that have shown love for Churchill and I'll include, as I'm playing against the west coast invaders based on the notion they will not take to this softer turf.

SATURDAY RACE #5 – DIRT MILE:

The head-to-head showdown of the undefeated #10 Catalina Cruiser (8/5) vs. the multiple Grade 1 winner #1 City of Light (5/2) highlights the Dirt Mile and may be the best stretch duel of the whole Breeders' Cup.

Catalina Cruiser has crushed his competition on the west coast in his four lifetime starts including two Grade 2 wins in his last two by a combined 14 lengths. Catalina Cruiser needs to answer a step up in class and will get that test with City of Light here. Coming off a disappointing runner-up finish at Saratoga in the Grade 1 Forego as the odds-on favorite after a very wide trip, City of Light has been working lights out (pun intended) at Santa Anita for up-and-coming trainer Mike McCarthy.

These two are head and shoulders above the field in talent and is the likeliest exacta of the whole Breeders' Cup. I'll be watching the probable payouts on the Catalina Cruiser / City of Light exacta closely and if I get decent value and up on the day, I may not make a strong exacta bet with these two.

The one horse to be beware that can mess up this plan is sophomore #7 Firenze Fire (6/1), if he brings his top race, like he did blitzing the one-turn Grade 3 Dwyer in July. If trainer Jason Servis' other horses (including World of Trouble) are running well before this race, I may need to be flexible and include Firenze Fire, on the notion Servis is priming his charges for the occasion.

#4 Seven Trumpets (15/1) is another three-year-old developing at the right time and is likely to be flying late to round out the bottom of the exotics for Churchill's all-time winning training Dale Romans.

SATURDAY RACE #6 – FILLY & MARE TURF:

In 2014, trainer Chad Brown brought the New York-bred Dayatthespa to this race and she won gate-to-wire over the Santa Anita turf at nearly 6/1 odds. Brown has won this race 3 of the past 6 years and looks to repeat the feat this time around with another New York-bred at similar odds, #1 Fourstarcrook (5/1). She is one of the five horses Brown has entered in this race, but should be a square price and in the best form of the quintet after winning her first Grade 1 in the Flower Bowl at Belmont over good turf to start October.

A Brown exacta is likely here, as three-time Grade 1 winner and favorite #6 Sistercharlie (3/1) looks to round back into form after missing some training time with a bruised hind foot after her impressive Grade 1 Beverly D. win in August. Both with be rolling home late, as stablemate #2 Thais (20/1) looks like a likely pace-setter, much like she was when Sistercharlie and Fourstarcrook ran 1-2 in the Beverly D. The inside paths at Churchill are expected to be good so watch the early turf races on the card to see if there is an inside, rail bias on the turf course.

The best of the Europeans looks to be #3 Wild Illusion (7/2) coming off an impressive win running to her favoritism in the prestigious Group 1 Prix de l'Opera at Longchamp in France. She should be fine if the turf comes up yielding for trainer Charlie Appleby, who won this race last year with Wuheida.

SATURDAY RACE #7 - SPRINT:

The key to handicapping the Sprint is if you think the speed will hold going 6 furlongs. Watching how the main track is playing leading up to this race is extremely important as there is a load of speed signed on here with #2 Promises Fulfilled (6/1) expected to burn up the track right from the gate. The sophomore sprint star faced his elders for the first time in the Grade 2 Phoenix at Keeneland and held off two top sprinters in #1 Whitmore (6/1) and #6 Limousine Liberal (6/1) to win in gutsy fashion.

If someone decides to try to press Promises Fulfilled, it may be favorite #5 Imperial Hint (9/5). The 6 furlongs should be right up Imperial Hint's alley, after faltering going 7 furlongs at Churchill in May. He has been the best sprinter on the east coast all year after losing to #9 Roy H (5/2) last year in this race.

Limousine Liberal will be tracking down the leaders in the final strides at the wire and would excel if the track has any moisture in it. The Ben Colebrook-trainee amazingly has won 6 of 8 lifetime starts at Churchill including the last two editions of the Grade 2 Churchill Downs over wet strips. Those two wins were at 7 furlongs and a major fear is that the 6 furlongs of this Sprint will not give him enough room to unleash his closing kick.

This race may be tough to make money betting, since it's difficult to have a strong opinion with an equally matched group. This is the perfect place to make some action bets only.

SATURDAY RACE #8 - MILE:

The Mile brings together a wide-open field that is tough to grasp, too, but kicks off the \$3 million guaranteed late Pick 4. If I'm up to this point I'll be constructing some Pick 4s based on input from my man Mike Somich, who you can find his analysis in this Guide.

#5 Oscar Performance (6/1) looks like the controlling speed here coming off a front-running win in the Grade 1 Woodbine Mile, which has been a key race for the Breeders' Cup Mile in recent years. As a Breeders' Cup winner as a juvenile, the Brian Lynch charge has the back class to beat an International field like this, but hasn't done his best racing in Kentucky, as he lost by 15 lengths in his one race over the Churchill turf in the Grade 2 American Turf last year over good turf. Most think he hates a soft turf, but he did win the Grade 3 Pilgrim over yielding turf as a juvenile.

The top Euros look to be #4 Polydream (5/1) and #7 Expert Eye (8/1), but it's difficult to know which Euro entry is best with no major standout. A soft turf would hamper Expert Eye's chances to stay the mile and blunt his explosive turn of foot, but he is definitely a proper Group 1 colt oversees. Polydream has tactical speed and has the right connections for this race with trainer Freddy Head, who won this race three years in a row with Goldikova. #11 Lightning Spear (20/1) is a veteran 7-year-old that brings a ton of back class at a long price here

Another American to watch is #15 Divisidero (30/1), who absolutely loves Churchill Downs, but will need to draw in from the Also Eligible list. If he makes the field, he should be used a a huge price. This is a race to play only action bets.

SATURDAY RACE #9 – DISTAFF:

The Distaff kicks off the back end of the two-day doubles and the hope is to be alive in those bets here, since this race is not going to provide a great betting opportunity, unless you play against one of the two favorites, #11 Monomoy Girl (2/1) and #2 Abel Tasman (7/2).

I have struggled over the past few weeks having the conviction to bet against Abel Tasman after her flop in the Grade 1 Zenyatta to end September. Maybe she was just sick and will be back to her old self in the Distaff, as she is the best filly in the race. You can check out our full article on RacingDudes.com about our analysis in our east vs. west debate.

I have loved Monomoy Girl for over a year and know she's ready for this race. I just can't see one of these two not winning this race, but have a strange feeling they won't end up being the exacta.

The key horse that may disrupt the exacta is #10 Blue Prize (6/1), who has been very consistent and loves Churchill. Therefore, I'll get her mixed in some action plays keying her with the top two, trying to get some value.

SATURDAY RACE #10 – TURF:

#2 Enable (1/1) is the star coming into the Breeders' Cup that everyone wants to see. The British-bred filly has won back-to-back, prestigious Group 1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphes and is fresh, as the Turf will be only her third race this year. An Arc winner has never won the Turf in the same year, so she has that going against her, but will be very tough to beat here at a short price.

I've been trying to find ways to play against her, but will play her with some longshots in exotics instead. If you can't beat her, then why not try to pound a few exactas to get a return? Everyone is saying the Americans have no shot in this race. The Europeans are usually much better going long on the grass and this 1½ mile trip is usually where they excel. The way the Americans in this division have beaten up on each other all year lends itself to the notion that there is no standout and the Euros

will dominate.

But sometimes in horse racing, you have to take a contrarian view to make some money. Therefore, I'm siding with two Americans in #3 Channel Maker (12/1) an #7 Glorious Empire (12/1) to try to spice up the exotics. I know that both will get good position early and Glorious Empire will likely set the pace way in front of the field, like he did winning the Grade 1 Sword Dancer at Saratoga in August. Channel Maker returned from his runner-up performance in the Sword Dancer to dominate the Grade 1 Joe Hirsch in front-running fashion at Belmont over soft turf. They dead-heated at Saratoga in the Grade 2 Bowling Green back in July over soft turf, so the footing at Churchill should be no problem. I ain't saying they are going to win, but sometimes in these turf races a horse gets on the lead and he doesn't come back to them. It can happen here at a big price!

SATURDAY RACE #11 – CLASSIC:

You may have noticed that the last four races have all totaled \$20 to \$24 per race. Once you start going through this exercise of laying out your bets for the day, the \$400 you budgeted gets ate up quick. The bets above will be pressed and not boxed, if I hit a few bets to get up, but the bets above give you an idea who I'll be looking to play.

With only \$54 left in my original \$400 budget, I better hope I'm up on the day because this Classic is one of the best betting races I have ever seen and deserves more than \$54 in bets.

#3 Catholic Boy (8/1) has been my boy all year and has looked great over the Churchill surface training the past two weeks. The impressive Grade 1 Travers winner will get a good position leaving from the 3 post and be able to save ground behind the leader, #9 Mendelssohn (12/1). Catholic Boy is my top pick in the Classic, but #11 Mind Your Biscuits and #10 Yoshida will be my main plays with him.

The all-world sprinter Mind Your Biscuits has shown the uncanny ability to stretch out, as he impressed winning the Grade 3 Lukas Classic at Churchill, after his runner-up finish in the Grade 1 Whitney, both at 1 1/8 mile. He now stretches out to this 1½ mile trip for the first time in his career, but he had plenty of gas left in the tank at the end of the Lukas Classic. If you're backing him, you must believe that his heart and grit will get him that extra furlong. He should get a good place early behind the pack of leaders and stalkers.

Yoshida may be farther back, but should get a good pace set-up with many horses looking to be near the lead early. The Grade 1 Woodward winning unleashed a big rally in his first dirt try and has looked regal over the Churchill dirt working out.


I don't fear the west coast invaders, favorite #14 Accelerate (5/2) or #7 West Coast (5/1), but I am a bit scared to play against #6 McKinzie (6/1), who was very impressive winning the Grade 1 Pennsylvania Derby after a long lay-off, in which he missed a shot at the Kentucky Derby. The Baffert-trainee was once his top sophomore prospect way before Justify won the Triple Crown this year. I'll mix McKinzie into my trifecta plays below and play against Accelerate and West Coast.

For the first time ever, we will have a Turf Sprint for the Juvenile's. This race drew a large number of entries, which certainly is an improvement over the now-defunct Juvenile Dirt Sprint. We will see if this race will stay around longer than that one did.

TOP CHOICE: #5 BULLETIN

This horse is the most intriguing of the bunch. He has just one race under his belt, yet that race was very fast. We will find out if experience matters in this race, as we have no data to go on currently. He may be the "speed of the speed."

Major Threats:

#1 Strike Silver, #10 So Perfect, #2 Soldier's Call, #3 Well Done Fox, #4 Stillwater Cove

A long list of threats here in a race where it is hard to separate the contenders from pretenders

OTHERS:

#9 Chelsea Cloisters, #14 Comedy, #6 Moonlight Romance, #7 Shang Shang Shang, #16 Legends of War, #11 Queen of Bermuda, #8 Sergei Prokofiev, #13 Big Drink of Water

Even these horses are ones to consider if the price is right. With this huge field size, and the presence of so much speed, anything can happen. This race is, without a doubt, the true definition of a crapshoot.

TOP CHOICE: #6 Newspaperofrecord

This could be the most talented juvenile in the country. In her two starts, nobody has even been close to beating her, with both wins coming by over six lengths. Her normal effort will dominate this group.

If any horse is going to beat Newspaperofrecord, it will have to

TOP CHOICE: #10 BELLAFINA

She is just too good to go against. Now the winner of three straight graded stakes events, Bellafina picked up her second straight Grade 1 win last time out in the Chandelier Stakes, where she dominated by over six lengths. If she fires her normal race this group will have a tough time beating her.

Major Threats:

#7 Jaywalk, #2 Serengeti Empress Jaywalk certainly will garner plenty of attention after dominating rivals last time out in the Grade 1 Frizette Stakes, which was her third straight victory. Serengeti Empress' last race was also something spectacular. It came in the Grade 2 Pocahontas Stakes, where she won by an outstanding 19 ½ lengths.

#1 Reflect, #4 Restless Rider, #9 Splashy Kisses, #6 Baby Nina, #5 Cassies Dreamer Restless Rider is easily the horse that stands out in this group. He was a close second to Opry in the Grade 3 With Anticipation, while also finishing a solid second in the Grade 3 Pilgrim to Forty Under. This shorter distance may help him today, though, while he also draws a perfect post position. He could be poised to pull an upset.

MaJOR THREATS:

#4 Forty Under, #8 Opry, #12 Current, #14 Anthony Van DyckForty Under was the most impressive horse coming out of the prep races for this event in the United States. He is a perfect two for two since moving to the turf.

event in the United States. He is a perfect two for two since moving to the turf. Opry was fourth in the Pilgrim after his impressive win in the With Anticipation at Saratoga. Current is another dangerous American horse, after using a furious late really down the center of the track to take home the Grade 3 Bourbon Stakes at Keeneland. Finally, Aidan O'Brien will also bring over Anthony Van Dyck.

Major Threats:

The top 2 finishers of the Grade 1 Champagne Stakes are top contenders to win this race. Complexity went fast early and late in that race to win, while being Chad Brown's best Kentucky Derby prospect. Code of Honor will appreciate the stretch out in distance here.

CODE OF HONOR- Stumbled at the gate in the GR1 Champagne yet finished with a burst of energy in the stretch to finish a good 2nd. With a clean getaway, the Shug McGaughey trained colt should appreciate the added distance and the 2 turns. Will close stoutly late to be a major factor.

LONGSHOT: TIGHT TEN- This Tapit colt was beaten only a 1/2 length in the GR3 Iroquois at CD going 1 1/16 He's been training smartly on the CD main track and if the track were to come up wet, this colt won't need his "rain boots" to run a huge race at a very square price

BET AGAINST: Taking a stand against the undefeated **GAME WINNER** who is the anticipated heavy favorite. There is a plethora of early speed that could prove troublesome for him. he will be hounded early and late from the opening bell.

JUVENILE TURF

LONGSHOT: *FORTY UNDER*- He won both his turf starts on a firm then yielding course. This colt rates kindly and packs a good closing kick, the son of Uncle Mo has a legit shot to upset at a good price.

BET AGAINST: BROOME has only been victorious once in 5 starts for A. O'Brien yet finished 2nd by a neck in a GR 1 Stakes at Longchamp on 10/7 His problem is that in his 3 prior starts he DWELT at the start in relatively small fields. TOO RISKY to play him in a 14 horse field.

TITOS HANDMADE VODKA JUVENILE FILLIES

MAJOR THREATS:

SIPPICAN HARBOR- Orb filly rallied from last place to win the GR1 Spinaway at Saratoga back on 9/1. Since the pace should be honest if not fast, look for this filly to make one sweeping move on the far turn to get up in the final strides to capture top honors.

REFLECT- She ran a creditable 2nd in the GR1 ALCIA-BEDES at Kee on 10/5 and love the fact that this filly is traing very well on the CD main track. She will need to run a career best to win but has a decent chance. Jockey James Graham will stay aboard for trainer Keith Desormeaux.

LONGSHOT: *CASSIE'S DREAMER*- She's been knocking on the door while finishing 3rd in her last couple of GR 1 Stakes. Trainer Barclay Tagg of Funny Cide fame claimed this gal for 50K ON Aug 8th. Could be a Cinderella Story if she were to upset this contentious group of fillies.

BET AGAINST: *HERMOSA*- This will be her 4th start in just 47 days. Despite her running a game 2nd in the GR 1 bet 365 Mile at Newmarket, it may take a toll on this filly to perform against this stellar group She most likely will chase the pace to NO avail.

JUVENILE TURF SPRINT

MAJOR THREATS:

STILLWATER COVE. She's trained by Wesley Ward and looks very formidable in this event at 5 1/2 F on the turf. 2 back she won at today's distance but tired in the final furlong going one mile in the GR1 Natalma at WO and will appreciate cutting back to her favorite distance. Look for her to score at a good price

SERGEI PROKOFIEV- A. O'Brien 's colt by Scat Daddy won his latest race at Newmarket on OCT 12th going 5F. He ran a career best and in his present form can be a handful against his competitors in his us debut.

LONGSHOT: POCKET DYNAMO had a very tough trip in his latest start at Newmarket in a GR3 event. He has shown promise/talent while finishing a very close 2nd to Shang Shang Shang back in June. With a clean trip and careful rating this colt is capable of pulling off a big surprise to pay double digits.

BET AGAINST: *SHANG SHANG SHANG* - She's been idle since the GR 2 Norfolk where he beat Pocket Dynamo by a whisker going 5F. Theres plenty of early speed to run with him and its no value to play her at a short price off a 4 month layoff .

RC CLASSIC

MAJOR THREATS:

THUNDER SNOW- will attempt to make amends for his debacle in the 2017 Ky Derby where he jumped up at the start and was PULLED UP

After losing by a neck in the JkClbGC-GR1 at 1 1/4 on 9/29 at Belmont, he is poised to run a career best in the Classic as the 4 yr old colt is training very well on the CD main track. His forte is tracking the leaders together with his fondness for 1 1 1/4 will make him a MAJOR PLAYER


ROARING LION: This 3 yr old Ky bred has been racing in England and Ireland banking more than 3.5 million while winning 4 Group 1 races in a row.

It's been only 14 days since his last victory at one mile on a soft turf in the GR1 QEStakes at Ascot but if he can handle the dirt, LOOK OUT!!

LONGSHOT: *SEEKING THE SOUL*- Expect a huge price on this 'blue collar' work horse. He rewarded his connections last year with a rousing victory in the GR1 Clark at CD going 1 1/8 . This 5 yr old has an affinity for this oval and thus could possibly pull off a great upset in the Classic

On the negative side he has never raced at 1 1/4. he is definitely worth a wager at generous odds.

BET AGAINST: ACCELERATE Despite winning 5 of 6 in 2018 including his latest victory in the GR1 Awesome



Again at SA on 9/28, he was 'all out' to win that event and was visually UNIMPRESSIVE racing wide throughout the race. Accelerate offers NO VALUE as he is making his first start at CD. GO ELSEWHERE

BC TURF

MAJOR THREATS:

ENABLE(GB) Won the GR1 ARC de Triomphe on 10/7. this 4 yr old is SPECIAL while winning 6 of 6 at the 1 1/2 mile distance. Jockey Frank Dettori has never lost on her and he is determined to keep that streak intact. she will have to buck the odds in that an Arc winner NEVER won the BC TURF. Quite sure she will have her running shoes on here in her 1st US start.

WALDGEIST(GB) This 4 yr old colt finished 4th behind Enable in the Arc but had some traffic problems with a 1/4 of a mile to go. Prior to the ARC he reeled off 4 victories in a row all at the distance of 1 1/2. Trained by the very capable Andre Fabre, this colt could very well be the right one in this very contentious running of the BC Turf.

LONGSHOT: CRYSTAL OCEAN(GB) He's won several Group races in England but has yet to win a GR1 event. 2 races back he ran an OK second to ENABLE at 1 1/2 on a synthetic surface where he spotted her 8 lbs. In the BC turf he'll have to spot her only 3. Trainer Sir Michael Stoute didn't bring his 4 yr old colt here just for the frequent flyer miles. Waldgeist is a possible UPSETTER.

BET AGAINST: *TALISMANIC*- Won last years edition of the BC Turf at Delmar while beating some tough foes. He was AWFUL in the ARC and frankly hasn't been relatively sharp this year as opposed to 2017. Despite having a good reputation and record in his career, he appears that he might be regressing

BC DISTAFF

MAJOR THREATS:

BLUE PRIZE(Arg) loves CD and the 1 1/8 distance. She's won 4 of 6 this year while her latest victory was at today's distance and was her first GR1 score. in her 5 races lifetime at CD she has 3 wins and 2 seconds. This 5 yr old mare has been ultra consistent during her career and should fare extremely well in the Distaff.

La FORCE (GER) This filly has been knocking on the door with three consecutive 2nd place finishes in GR1 races in California. It's possible that she is shy of the Winners Circle but with her running style of closing ground late, CD may be the surface she needs to achieve her 'Blue Ribbon'

LONGSHOT: CHAMPAGNE PROBLEMS has only won 1 race of 9 at CD but has 4 seconds and 2 thirds. She finished right behind Blue Prize in her last 2 starts and just might be able to turn the tables on her with extra patient handling by Calvin Borel. Not impossible by any means at good odds.

BET AGAINST: *ABEL TASMAN* ran a distant 5th in her last start at SA on 9/30 after a troubled start going off at 10 cents to the dollar. She has been lightly raced while winning only 2 races in her last 6 outings dating back to Sep 2017. She's 1 for 2 at CD on a sloppy oval and with these negatives I'll toss her.

BC SPRINT

MAJOR THREATS:

LIMOUSINE LIBERAL- loves CD main track having won 6 of 8 lifetime starts. Disregard his 3rd place finish in his latest start vs Promises Fulfilled and Whitmore as he had an horrendous trip in the stretch drive only to lose top honors by a 1/2 length. With any kind of racing luck, look for this 6 yr old gelding having his picture taken in the Winners Circle.

WHITMORE- hard hitting gelding who almost always FIRES. He'll need confident handling and a good trip to win. Although he is only 1 for 3 on the oval, he has been victorious 9 of 13 tries at the 6F distance. Must respect.

LONGSHOT: DISTINCTIVE B- Another old veteran gelding who is a reformed claimer. Trainer Peter Miller has the senior guy feeling his oats as he finished 2nd best to Roy H in a GR1 event at SA ON 10/6 Would be nice for the geriatric son of With Distinction to upset this contentious field

BET AGAINST: *IMPERIAL HINT* it would be insane to fault this 5 yr old after having won 12 of 18 starts lifetime but despite his envious record and his current mint condition, I'll take a stand against him as he failed to hit the board in 2 career starts at CD on a fast and a



sloppy oval. Might be overanalyzing BUT at a very low price, lets try and beat him. Imperial Hint is NO LOCK.

BC DIRT MILE

MAJOR THREATS:

CATALINA CRUISER- 4 yr old colt who is lightly raced is UNDEFEATED winning once as a 3yr old and thrice in 2018. His last 2 victories were impressive GR2 scores both at Del Mar. He will be forwardly placed as usual and if he can adapt to the CD surface, he'll be a really tough customer to overhaul. He's trained by the veteran conditioner John Sadler.

SEVEN TRUMPETS is owned by prolific owner West Point Thoroughbreds and might well be ready to blow his 'horn" in the WINNERS CIRCLE.. He's been training steadily on the CD oval which he ADORES having been a perfect 3 for 3 during his short career. Trained by the gregarious Dale Romans, his colt has a big shot.

LONGSHOT: *ISOTHERM*- has shown improvement switching from primarily the turf onto the dirt. He finished 3rd by only 2 3/4 lengths to the probable BC Classic favorite ACCELERATE in the GR1 awesome Again at SA on 9/29 at 1 1/8 .He cuts back to a one turn mile and although a monumental task at hand might be able to pull off a major upset at a real good price.

BET AGAINST: Yes, I'm aware *CITY OF LIGHT* beat *ACCELERATE* in early spring at OP but the consistent 4 yr oldl will make his first start at CD going a one turn mile for the very first time also. Back in August he was odds on to win the GR1 Forego at Saratoga and although he finished 2nd didn't look right to me. He'll take lots of money here but NOT mine.

FILLY AND MARE SPRINT

MAJOR THREATS:

MARLEY'S FREEDOM- has really blossomed under Bob Baffert who took over her conditioning in May. The 4 yr old daughter of Blame has won 3 consecutive races at 3 different race tracks and at 3 different sprint distances. She's been working like a tigress after receiving a short respite from her latest victory in Aug at the SPA in the

GR 1 Ballerina going 7F. SHE appears BEST in a very deep field of female sprinters.

LONGSHOT: *STORMY EMBRACE* IS trained by Kathleen O'Connell who is a veteran conditioner. The 4 yr old filly has been racing mostly in Florida and has 7 career victories in 20 starts. She ran huge 2 back in the GR2 Princess Rooney at GP going today's distance of 7f at 15-1 in June. Was that a fluke?

She had a prep race at GP where she had trouble and finished a disappointing 3rd at 1=2. No doubt she will BIG ODDS here but she might just be a live longshot.

BET AGAINST:

SELCOURT- This 4 yr old daughter of Tiz Wonderful won 3 consecutive races at SA in the winter of 2018. She's been on vacation since and although she has been training steadily, it seem a monumental task to win a BC race off a long layoff and just workouts. She'll take some money but it may be too tough an assignment to overcome not to mention 1st try at CD.

BC TURF SPRINT

MAJOR THREATS:

WORLD OF TROUBLE: This 3 yr old colt found a home on the grass. He won both turf starts in Stakes company at Saratoga and Belmont. While being conditioned by a high % trainer in Jason Servis. This colt has alot of UP-SIDE. he showed that he can rate despite having good speed. he should be a square price and has a legit chance.

DISCO PARTNER- Has been victorious in 10 of his 21 lifetime starts. He needs a solid pace to make his late run very effective and should get an honest if not an early contested hot pace to run a. Must respect his chances here as he will be very dangerous with a clean trip.

LONGSHOT: WILL CALL- This guy has one thing going in his favor here and that is he is undefeated on the CD turf course. On any given day he could jump up and run YUUUGE. Case in point: he narrowly missed winning the GR2 Woodford at Keenland on 10/7 going 5 1/2f. Demand a square price!!

BET AGAINST: *LOST TREASURE*- A. O'Brien trained colt has won 3 of 7 in 2018 but did lose his last 3 racing in France and Ireland. he ran OCT 19th and will attempt to win off a 14 day layoff. It would actually be his 3rd start in the last 19 days Can't recommend.

BC MILE

MAJOR THREATS:

EXPERT EYE- 3 yr old colt is owned by Juddmonte Farms Ltd and conditioned by Sir Michael Stoute. In his last 2 of 3 starts in Group 1 races Expert Eye had a 2nd and 3rd place finish. He has tactical speed and should be in a good spot to earn his first GR1 victory

MUSTASHRY- knows how to win as he captured 3 of his last 4 albeit against a bit weaker opponents. He can go to the lead, stalk or close ground late which is very advantageous in a bulky field. DON'T OVERLOOK!

LONGSHOT: *POLYDREAM* is a 3 yr old filly who disappointed badly in her latest start vs the boys in the GR 1 Qatar Prix de la Foret at Longchamp on 10/7 Prior to that poor effort, she had won a GR1 event against her elders/boys at 5-1. She likely will be overlooked off her dull performance yet those who still believe in her can be rewarded with a handsome payout

BET AGAINST: *OSCAR PERFORMANCE*- this colt rebounded nicely off his unfortunate outing in the GR1 Arlington Million by winning the WO mile on 9/15. He seems to need things his own way and in a bulky field he will meet just might be too much to ask for. This will be his toughest task to date. I can NOT recommend him vs this ultra-competitive field.

BC FILLY AND MARE TURF

MAJOR THREATS:


WILD ILLUSION(GB) -This 3yr old filly is in mint form having won her last 2 GR1 races at Goodwood and Lonchamp respectively at 1 1/4 vs her elders. Her connections should not have any apprehension for her getting 1 3/8 as she raced at 1 1/2 earlier in the season resulting in a couple of 2nd place finishes. She is the one to beat for my money.

MAGIC WAND(IRE) this 3 yr old daughter of Galileo has finished 2nd twice in a row in GR1 races in Sep and Oct. Aidan O'Brien will try and turn the tables on WILD ILLUSION but it won't be an easy task. This gal has indeed room to improve and should NOT be overlooked.

LONGSHOT: *EZIYRA(IRE)* 4 Yr old filly has won 4 of her last 5 Group races dating back to AUG 2017. She's won GR2 and GR3 but in her only try at a GR1 two races back she can only manage a 3rd place finish. This filly has ability but will need an A+ performance to capture the top spot.

BET AGAINST: *FOURSTAR COOK*- 6 yr old NY bred mare has done little wrong in her career having won 12 of 19 career starts. She also has a GR 1 victory having accomplished that in her most recent outing on 10/7 in the Flower Bowl at Belmont going a 1 1/4. This will be her first attempt at 1 3/8.

Chad Brown fans will back her but these European invaders are real tough. Go elsewhere!!! ■



RIGUES'S RREFIERS' GUP PICKS

"Big Lee" is still working in foreign exchange but is the definition of a Weekend Warrior! He too has that "old school" ethic (buy the form and do the work!) and is known for picking wild longshots and has hit many a superfecta! His stint on Horseplayers gave the world a look at his big heart and over the top personality!

JUVENILE FILLIES TURF

BEST BET: *NEWSPAPEROFRECORD* - With the turf looking yielding, this IRE bred is already 2 for 2. Looks like my Friday single. STALKER

MAJOR THREATS:

CONCRETE ROSE - This daughter of the great Frankel should benefit from a nice pace and have a much easier time against her own kind. Broke maiden on the off going. CLOSER

EAST – My original pick but 14 is a tough post, even for this daughter of Frankel. CLOSER

NEWSPAPEROFRECORD - This Chad Brown-trained filly looks like the clear favorite in this mile turf event. She's been working good and should enjoy the cut back in distance. STALKER

LONGSHOT: *PRINCESA CAROLINA* - This Tapit filly needs some pace and a break, but she can cross the wire at a huge price to give trainer Kenny McPeek his first BC win.

NO SHOT: MY GAL BETTY - At a short price, I am looking elsewhere. Trainer Roger Attfield only wins at a 9% rate in Graded Stakes events!

JUVENILE TURF SPRINT

MAJOR THREATS:

STRIKE SILVER - With so much speed in here, this Mark Casse-trained colt will get a great chance to run them down in the final furlong, and he has been working great! CLOSER

STILLWATER COVE - This Quality Road filly will probably enjoy the cut back to the 5 1/2-furlong distance that she loved when winning at Saratoga this summer. STALKER

LONGSHOT: *MOONLIGHT ROMANCE* - She's a notch below these other foes, but at a square price, she is a must-use for any value player! STALKER

NO SHOT: *BULLETIN* – With lots of pace in this one,trainer Todd Pletcher has his work cut out for him. At a short price, this one is not for me.

JUVENILE FILLIES

MAJOR THREATS:

CASSIES DREAMER - Her trainer, Tom Amoss, is a good handler, and this filly has a win over this track and at this distance. She had plenty of excuses in previous race, and should like the wet!!

RESTLESS RIDER – Third back off the bench. Posts a huge wet number.

SERENGETI EMPRESS - Her trainer, Tom Amoss, is a good handler, and this filly has a win over this track and at this distance. Working well and speed in the wet. Dangerous.

LONGSHOT: *REFLECT* - She has been getting better and better with each race, has been working well, and with a fast pace, she should be flying late for trainer Keith Desormeaux at a big price! CLOSER

NO SHOT: *BELLAFINA* - After winning a pair of Grade 1s in California, she will be a likely big chalk, but she only ran against five-horse fields both times. She is not for me!

JUVENILE TURF

BEST VALUE PLAY:

FORTY UNDER - This Uncle Mo-sired colt is also getting better with every race. Trainer Jeremiah Englehart has a chance here. Like CURRENT, he will have plenty of

pace while sitting a nice stalking trip at this mile distance.

MAJOR THREATS:

UNCLE BENNY – Big closer in a race that has plenty of speed.

CURRENT - Looks like trainer Todd Pletcher has a good one here. Bred like a monster, he has improved in every race. He has a nice closing kick and should get a great setup! CLOSER

NO SHOT: *MUCH BETTER* - Because he fires at "just" 15% on turf, this is the best chance to beat trainer Bob Baffert this weekend. This horse will probably be overbet and is not for me!

JUVENILE

MAJOR THREATS:

CODE OF HONOR - McGaughey/Johnny V hook up with a future star in the filly division.

GAME WINNER – Baffert is a perfect 3 for 3 with this colt. He's been working great and looks the part. STALKER

COMPLEXITY – This Grade 1 Champagne winner is the speed of speeds and will be the one to catch.

LONGSHOT: *GUNMETAL GRAY* - He was second to *GAME WINNER* in one of those five-horse events. With a bigger field here, he has a good chance at pulling an upset. He just needs a clean start. STALKER

FILLY AND MARE SPRINT

MAJOR THREATS:

MARLEY'S FREEDOM - In a race with plenty of pace, this Bob Baffert-trained filly can get the perfect setup to make it five wins in a row! CLOSER

MIA MISCHIEF - She has speed and loves CD (two firsts and two seconds in four career starts here).

LONGSHOT: GOLDEN MISCHIEF - At a square price and with all of the speed entered here, this Brad Cox-trained filly should get a nice trip.

NO SHOT: SELCOURT - She has speed and is three-forthree this year, but she has others to run against in her first start at CD. Not for me!

TURF SPRINT MAJOR THREATS:

WILL CALL - He loves the track and distance, should get a nice trip, and has a good closing kick. STALKER

STORMY LIBERAL - One of three from trainer Peter Miller in the race, the defending champion has won his last three and represents his barn's biggest shot! STALKER

LONGSHOT: *RUBY NOTION* - This sneaky-good filly is stepping up to the big time at a big price! She has a win over the track and at the distance. CLOSER

NO SHOT: *RICHARD'S BOY* - Another from trainer Peter Miller, last year's runner-up has no chance this year. Not for me.

DIRT MILE

MAJOR THREATS:

CATALINA CRUISER - This undefeated colt should be the one to beat and looks like the best chance to give trainer John Sadler his first BC win.

CITY OF LIGHT - This 4-year-old by Quality Road should get the perfect stalking trip and have a chance.

LONGSHOT: SEVEN TRUMPETS - If a speed duel takes place, he can pick up the pieces late and is undefeated in three starts here at CD. CLOSER

NO SHOT: FIRENZE FIRE - This 3-year-old will be overbet but has zero chance!

FILLY AND MARE TURF

MAJOR THREATS:

SISTERCHARLIE - She hasn't done much wrong and should definitely get a piece of the money. She is the best of the American entries. CLOSER

WILD ILLUSION - The one to beat, she looks like a single!

FOURSTAR CROOK - This solid mare has done nothing wrong and should get a nice price due to the talent in this field.

NO SHOT: A RAVING BEAUTY - With a history of struggling at longer distances, I'll pass.



SPRINT

MAJOR THREATS:

IMPERIAL HINT - His last three wins were visually amazing and he could be rider Javier Castellano's best chance at a BC win. This big chalk will be a single on some tickets. STALKER

LIMOUSINE LIBERAL - This tough-knocking horse always tries!

ROY H - You will get a squarer price than you should on the defending champion, largely due to the competition entered.

NO SHOT: *PROMISES FULFILLED* - The speed of speeds, he was all-out to beat WHITMORE and LIMOUSINE LIBERAL. He is not for me!

MILe

MAJOR THREATS:

OSCAR PERFORMANCE - This son of Kitten's Joy has been nothing but amazing in his turf career. He has earned over \$2 million with eight wins in 14 starts.

MUSTASHRY - Trainer Sir Michael Stoute and Sheikh Hamdan Al Maktoum team up with this gelding from abroad. He should be well-backed! STALKER

LONGSHOT: NEXT SHARES - This 5-year-old is in the best shape his career, and at a big price, he is a mustuse.

NO SHOT: ANALYZE IT - This 3-year-old will get his chance down the road, but in here, he's a toss at a short price.

DISTAFF

MAJOR THREATS:

ABEL TASMAN - This filly is running her third start off of the layoff and has an excuse for her last race's dull effort. The class of the field, she is working great and has trainer Bob Baffert on her side!

LA FORCE - She lost by only a 1/2-length to UNIQUE BELLA last out.

LONGSHOT: *VALE DORI* - You should get a nice price on this Bob Baffert-trained mare in her third start back. She will be on or close to the lead.

NO SHOT: *MONOMOY GIRL* - At a short price against the best older horses in the world, she is not for me!

TURF

MAJOR THREATS:

ENABLE - She will be the chalk and a single in many exotic plays.

MAGICAL - She gets another shot at ENABLE but will most likely be second at best .

LONGSHOT: *SADLER'S JOY* - Not sure how many more he has left in the tank, but this classy son of Kitten's Joy always puts in a good effort.

NO SHOT: *HI HAPPY* - He will get bet down to a shorter price, so I must disregard

CLASSIC

MAJOR THREATS:

THUNDER SNOW – He's 1 for 2 in the wet and should sit the perfect trip. Thunder Snow is my best value play of the Breeders' Cup!

ACCELERATE – Great year and an amazing career. Wet. Working great. Only negative is the post!

WEST COAST – Can't leave Bobby B out of any big event. Johnny V looking to impress.

NO SHOT: *MIND YOUR BISCUITS* - The shoe will finally drop on this amazing, tough-knocking horse. The distance will prove to be too much, and at a shorter-than-average price, I must toss him aside!

BREEDERS' CUP 2018 THE RECEIPTION OF THE PROPERTY OF THE PROP

Mike started going to the track when he was 3 months old. Over the summers, he spent multiple weeks a year cutting his teeth at Saratoga. Since taking horse handicapping seriously at the end of 2017, he's cashed over 15 five figure tickets, hit both massive Rainbow 6 carryovers at Gulfstream and tore up Del Mar including a \$35,000 cash off \$148. He's a regular writer for RacingDudes.com with his series Handicapping 301 and a co-host on the Magic Mike Show brought to you by the Racing Dudes.

Before we get into it, let's start out with a PSA. My style of betting is not for the weak of heart. I will offer the most risk of any of the people who are offering plays that they will be making at this year's Breeders' Cup. I'll be betting between \$1,000-\$1,500 over the course of the two days and it's completely possible I will not cash a ticket. Now, I've been fortunate four of the last five years with big time winning weekends, but it's horse racing, it's gambling. I'm also the most likely to cash a ticket for \$25,000. That's why Racing Dudes asked me to write this piece.

When I structure the tickets below, it's built to make the most out of the opinions that I've got. I spent more time working out the combinations and actual bets than I did handicapping the races. With multi-race wagers, how you bet is as important as who you bet if you want to be profitable over the long term.

Now that's out of the way, let's kick it off with Friday's card!

BREEDER'S CUP FRIDAY

Race 1 - Pick 5:

This is a bet that I feel is WAY undervalued each year. People spend 5-10% of their time handicapping these races since you only have one Breeder's Cup race and the payouts are always nice. I kicked off my weekend last year cashing this Pick 5 for \$1, paying over \$5,000, and I was a winner for the weekend off that cash alone.

Race 1 – This is the race that I like the least of the sequence. If you wanted to either spend more money or

have a strong opinion later in the card, then go all here. For me, I'm going three deep to kick it off. We will start with #3 Stronger Than Ever who will be facing older for the first time. She's been facing some very good 2YO/3YOs and has been improving. Two back she ran without Lasix so let's throw that one out. Without it, the progression is excellent and now she's in with company that fits. I'll back her up #4 Dutch Parrot who's another that's getting back to where she fits. The last one was on turf, chuck it, and prior to that she faced Blue Prize who will be in the Distaff on Saturday. This is the right spot for her. Finally, in a paceless race, let's take the speed of #2 Sweet Legacy who's second off a layoff.

Race 2 – I'm going to spread here as well since there is some nice first timers. Let's use #2 Admire, #7 Midnight Curfew, and #9 Gray Attempt, who will all be going out for the first time that have been working well for trainers who can get horses home first out. I like Gray Attempt the most of the three who's been working well over the track and by Graydar, who can get young horses home early in their career. #5 Chess Chief and #6 Captain Von Trapp faced each other last time out and I'm simply not willing to play one without the other. Race 3 - #3 Patch is probably the best horse in the race, but will be over bet so I'm going to include a couple others with him that I think can get home. Let's use the #6 Westerland who jumped up last time running at this level and on dirt for the first time in his career. I'm expecting a step forward second time on dirt and he should like the one turn mile today. #7 J Boys Echo will be the other horse I'm using here. He's a lightly raced 4-year-old who's 3-year-old numbers are actually better than Patch. He's run well at Churchill in the past and

this is his second time off a LONG layoff so I'm projecting a big step forward.

Race 4 – This race came up very, very interesting. I don't see how you leave off #2 Improbable who's shipping in for Bob Baffert and looked like a monster first time out. I'm not willing to single here because of #8 Louder Than Bombs who's trying dirt for the first time. I love me some Violence and it's a very interesting move to take a stakes winner on the turf and move him over to the dirt. David Fawkes is very successful with this move, 33% dirt to turf, and this screams like a horse the connections think might end up on the derby trail and that's why he is trying dirt. If it's muddy, watch out for #3 Trophy Chaser as well.

Race 5 - Well, this is just WIDE open! I'm going five deep to close this out. Magic made a good case for #2 Soldier's Call who ran well against older last time out and should make the lead from the 2 post. I'll use one other shipper, #8 Sergei Prokofiev who could kick off a big weekend for Ryan Moore and Aidan O'Brien. #1 Strike Silver, by Violence, did nothing wrong in his turn debut and closed 6 lengths in a blink of an eye. There's a ton of pace in here so we should be gobbling up ground late again. Do NOT leave #4 Stillwater Cove off any tickets! She simply went too long last time out at a mile, but her sprinting effort two back is the best race of any North American horse sub 6F on the turf. Take 20-1 all day on her. Finally, I'll use #5 Bulletin who will be bet down from a 10-1 ML. This Pletcher trainee debuted in a \$82,000 stakes race and blew the field out by 7 lengths. City Zip is a great win early sire, if she can rate, she is dangerous.

Race 5 – Pick 5: Race 5 – Using the same as above

Race 6 – Let's not over think this, #6 Newspaper-ofrecord is very good. However, I'm not singling her here because of a European invader that's sitting at 20-1 on the ML. #14 East should not be overlooked here. She's running for her 3rd time today and if she improves at the same rate then watch out. She's also a homebred daughter of Frankel (Galileo) out of an Indian Ridge mare. So yeah, there is some talent here.

Race 7 - #10 Bellafina has not let me down yet and she's the best horse here again. If I used a second here, it's #4 Restless Rider who got a terrible trip in the Spinaway and still almost won. She's improving every race (shown by her G1 win last out) and if Bellafina is a noshow shipping in, Restless Rider is the play.

Race 8 – Since we're two and one deep in the last two, let's spread like butter in the next two legs. #2 Uncle Benny just got up last out first time on the turf at six furlongs. He'll like the extra distance today being a son of Declaration of War (War Front). #3 Much Better should be much better today second time out on the turf, second time around two turns. This Baffert runner was bet heavily first out on turf and should be sitting close to the lead. #6 Henley's Joy and #12 Current were a nose apart last time out and both could improve again here. The jockey change on #10 War of Will could be extremely impactful since Rosario is most likely going to take this son of War Front off the lead like he did two back. The mile today is also a better distance then the 1 1/16th at which the previous two beat him last time out. The must use invader here is #14 Anthony Van Dyck who just keeps improving.

Race 9 – I will not accept 9/5 on #9 Game Winner so I'm going to go DEEEEEP here. #1 Dueling is one that I've talked about for a while. The hip was dropped first time out, was against a track bias the second time out and both of those where too short for this son of.....Violence. I'm not sure how you leave off #5 Well Defined at 20-1. Mike Smith, who's got a Magic Mike Show award named after him, took this horse over Dueling and he just keeps improving. We're also going to use #6 Complexity, #8 Standard Deviation, and #11 Code of Honor.

I'll also use #10 Rocketry who may have found a new career going long on the dirt last time out running top Beyer first time over the dirt.

BREEDER'S CUP SATURDAY

Race 1 - Pick 5

Let's jump right into this with a single. My plan here is to play more on the Pick 4 starting in the second, so I'll key on #5 Mo's Mojo here. Last time out was a glorified work out going 6.5F. He's wanted longer last year as a 3-year-old and get's it today second time out as a 4-year-old. Any improvement over last year's G3 Matt Winn at this track, over this distance, puts him in the winner's circle today.

Race 2 – This race really starts with #3 Audible. It's interesting to see him coming back at 7F, which is not his best distance. It is enough for me to spread here. Let's add #2 Honorable Treasure who was a favorite against many of these last time out and has run well at Churchill. 12-1 doesn't hurt either. #11 Still Having Fun and #12 Super Sol are both too good to leave off at his distance as well. Super Sol has more upside, but Still Having Fun is the most proven. Both of them should be on every ticket trying to beat Audible.

Race 3 – I'm simply not sold on #13 Marley's Freedom and beating her and Audible in the same sequence can make a weekend. #1 Selcourt whooped up on her last time they faced each other and has gotten better each time she breaks from the gate. If it wasn't for Sadler, I'd consider singling here, but I can only single one Sadler horse today. #9 Stormy Embrace is coming in second off a layoff and thrashed a "Win and Your In" race in June at Gulfstream. Don't overlook her at 20-1, she's only missed the money once at 7F which is specialist distance. The horse for course here is #11 Finley'sluckycharm who's 6 for 7 at Churchill and 2 for 6 at the distance. She can stalk and pounce which may

be the perfect trip with the speed drawn in here. If #15 Dream Pauline gets in (she's AE) then I'm using this lightly raced daughter of Tapit who has been ultra-impressive in her two career starts.

Race 4 – These turf sprints often produce a nice price. Just look to last year when #9 Stormy Liberal won at 30-1. This year we are only getting 4-1, but I'm still going to use him. #5 Disco Partner is too dangerous not to use, but if it's soft turf I will be cutting him from my tickets. There are three prices that I'm going to try to get home here. #1 Ruby Notion has ran HUGE the last two races and fits here. Don't knock her for the Beyer regression last out at Kentucky Downs. We've already seen multiple winners come from those races with Beyers lower than normal due to the course style. #4 Vision Perfect has the ability to win this race and is a big overlay at 15-1. Like the jockey change to Castellano here as well. My top longshot and a horse I will be using all over the place is #7 Lost Treasure who will be invading from Europe. This one of War Front is carrying his low career weight today. He carried 137lbs last time out, and has continued to improve. He's 20-1 for the Moore/O'Brien duo that should have a big weekend. Race 5 – Let's go ahead and single one of the best three horses at the Breeder's Cup this year, #10 Catalina Cruiser. I'd pick him in the Classic so I'll single him

Race 6 – This was one of the tougher races for me, but in the end, I'm going to pass on all of the Chad Brown

turfers here and play three Europeans. #3 Wild Illusion and #10 Magic Wand are the class of the field. They have been facing better overseas and if they get an off turf, they get even more dangerous. I'm also going to include #14 Eziyra who was only 3 Lenghts off Sea of Class two back and has beaten Magic Wand, yet is sitting 15-1 on the ML. If I played any of the Brown horses it would be #6 Sistercharlie, whom I considered a single before seeing the Euro's that are coming in for this one. Race 7 – The Sprint is probably the race I am looking forward to the most. Including #2 Promises Fulfilled is a must, since going back to sprinting he's been untouchable and the scratch of X Y Jet gives him the lead if he wants it. #5 Imperial Hint has done nothing wrong and has to be included as well. Same can be said of #9 Roy H. Finally, #1 Whitmore makes the ticket. Both loses at Belmont where on Santana who miss rode the track. He knows Churchill well and loves the distance going 9 for 13 lifetime. I'm leaving off #8 Limousine Liberal unless it rains. He's simply better at 7F.

Race 7 – Pick 5 See Race 7 comments above.

Race 8 – Another good example of the Kentucky Down Beyers is #2 Next Shares who keeps improving as a 5-year-old. He fits well here and draws nicely in the two hole. #5 Oscar Performance has done nothing wrong at this distance as a 4-year-old. He broke the track record in his first start of the year at Belmont in the G3 Poker and wired the field in the G3 Woodbine Mile. There is not much speed in this one so he may go to the lead and never look back. Let's use two shippers as well. #4 Polydream just missed to Wild Illusion last year and beat James Garfield two back. She was a heavy favorite last out and had a terrible trip. I'll give her a pass there. #8 I Can Fly missed by a neck to Roaring Lion, who's in the Classic, last time out. He'll be flying late and will need to get a good trip.

Race 9 – I've been saying it for months so I'm not going to change my mind now. #2 Abel Tasman is a single. Race 10 – Everyone needs to appreciate just how good #2 Enable has been in her career. She's averaging \$850,561 in earnings PER RACE! To put that in perspective, no other horse in this race has earned \$850k

this year, let alone per start. She's 5 for 5 against the boys and ran a 130 timeform rating as a 3-year-old, which is a 116 Beyer equivalent. That is the highest of any horse, in any race, on any surface. I'll cover a little with #12 Waldgeist who has been an improving 4-year-old.

Race 11 – The Classic is wide open this year! My top pick is an unlikely one at the start of the year. Chad Summers has done a wonderful job with #11 Mind Your Biscuits who will be right there at the top of the lane. His last over the track was huge and projecting improvement second off a layoff isn't crazy. The hate has gone too far on #14 Accelerate so he'll be the other pick on my short tickets. He's got tactical speed to overcome the 14 post and his A game is the best in the field. On deeper tickets, add #2 Roaring Lion who will be awfully dangerous if he takes to the dirt. We will close it out with the two Baffert horses, #6 McKinzie and #7 West Coast.
